Mood refers to the emotional atmosphere or feeling that a reader experiences when reading a text. It's like the emotional backdrop that surrounds the reader as they engage with the text.

General atmosphere: Mood sets the overall emotional feeling of a story, poem, or any other literary work.

Created gradually: Mood develops throughout a literary work.

Established elements: Several factors contribute to mood, including setting, imagery, tone, and word choice.

Mood is not the same as tone: While tone reflects the author's attitude, mood focuses on the reader's emotional response.

Eerie	Strange and frightening	The eerie music set a spooky mood for the movie.	
Exhilarating	Causing one to feel excited and full of energy	The exhilarating car chase scene left the audience on the edge of their seats.	
Foreboding	A feeling that something bad will happen	The dark clouds created a fore-boding mood in the story.	
Gloomy	Dark or poorly lit, especially so as to appear depressing	The gloomy setting reflected the character's somber mood.	
Idyllic	Extremely happy, peaceful, or picturesque	The idyllic scenery in the novel created a serene mood.
